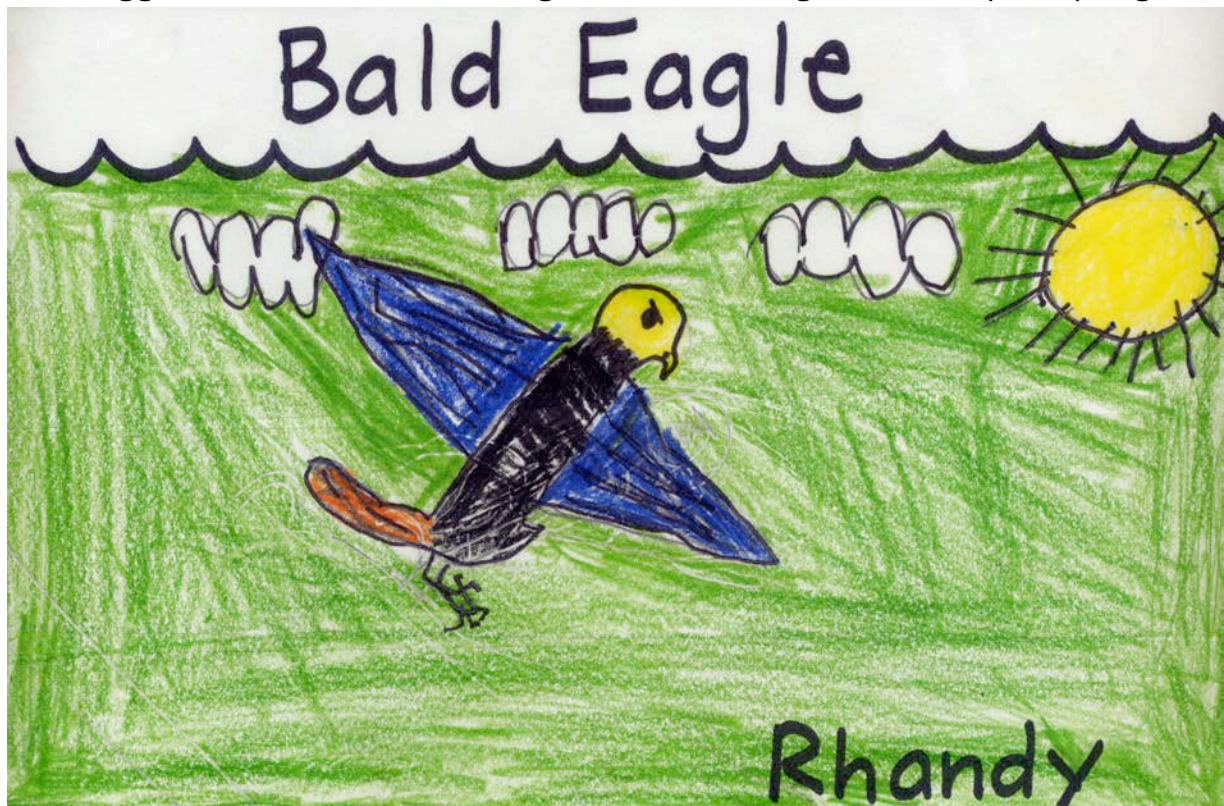

Bald Eagle

Habitat:

- Florida warm weather
- Bald eagles typically nest in the forested areas adjacent to large bodies of water staying when possible away from heavily developed areas.

Physical Description:

- Bald Eagles have 7200 feathers.
- They are 30 inches tall.

Nest/Nesting Materials:

- The bald eagle builds the largest nest ever built of North America bird up to 13 feet deep and 8.2 feet and wide.

Eggs:

- Bald Eagles eggs are round and there small.
- 2.3-3.3 in dull white usually with out markings.

Food:

- Fish of many kinds construe the center piece of the Bald Eagle diet [common examples include salmon hering shad and catfish.

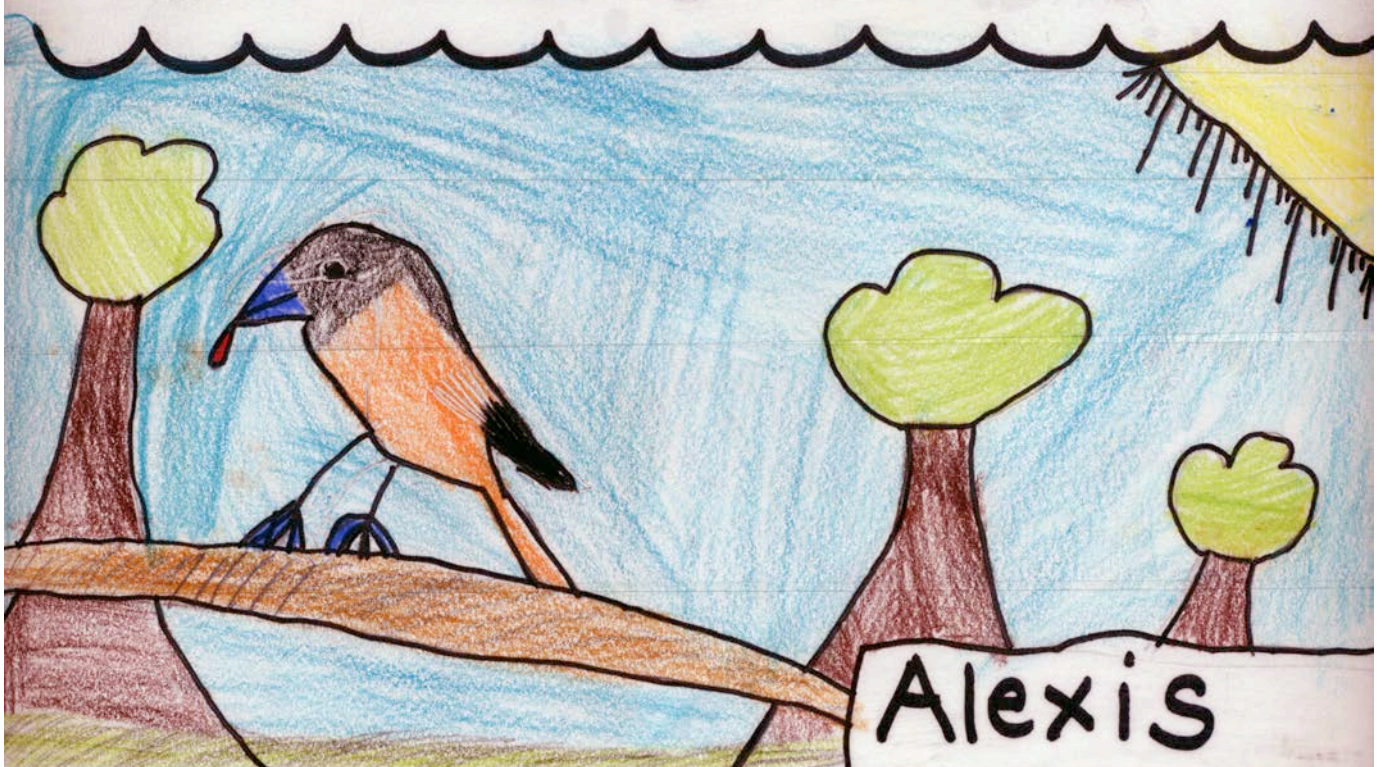

Physical Description:(Adult male)

- Slender body shape with sharp, pointed bill. Bright orange underparts with black head. Black and white wings with orange shoulders. Black tail tipped with orange. Wingspan) 23-30 cm.

Nest/Nesting Materials:

- Nest site is in tall deciduous trees placed near end of slender drooping branch. Usually 20-30 feet above the ground but can be 6-60 feet up or higher. Nest is a hanging pouch with its rim firmly attached to a branch.

Eggs:

- 4-5 sometimes 3-6 bluish white to pale gray with brown and black markings concentrated at larger end. Incubation is by female about 12-14 days.

Food:

- Baltimore Orioles eat insects, fruit and nectar.

Did You Know?

1. Baltimore Orioles got their name from their black and orange plumage
2. Young male orioles don't molt into bright orange adult in the fall of the second year
3. Orioles sometimes use their slender beaks to feed unusual way called gaping.

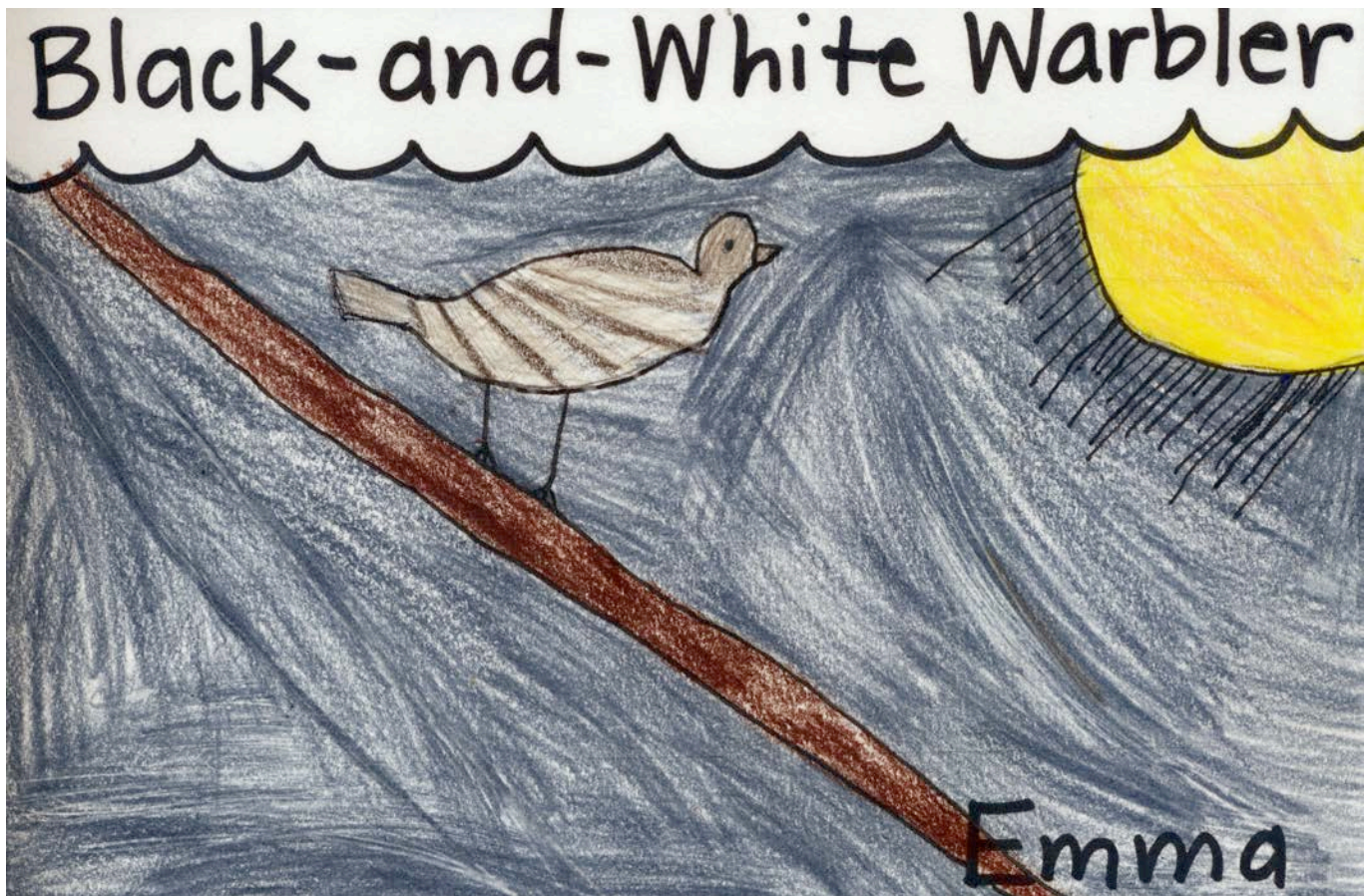

Great Egrets live in fresh and saltwater that includes marshes, ponds, canals, rice fields, mudflats, seashores. Tall long legged wading birds with S-curved necks and long dagger-like bills. Very big with black legs and orange yellow bill. A great egret's face will turn light neon green. Nests in trees. 1-6 eggs at a time in nest. Eggs are pale smooth light blue. 5.5-6 cm. Great egret's food is crayfish, frogs, algae, fish, insects, small birds, small snakes, anoles. Voice is dry croaking sound, nasal squeals. Raccoons are a big danger to all great egret eggs.



Great Egret

Habitat:

- Freshwater or saltwater lakes in the shallows. Also in marshes, ponds, rice fields, mudflats, and seashores.

Physical Description:

- Tall long legged wading birds with long S-curved necks and long dagger-like bills. Very big with black legs and an orange-yellow beak.

Nest/Nesting Materials:

- Nests in trees. 1-6 eggs at a time in the nest.

Eggs:

- Light blue. 5.5-6 cm.

Food:

- Crayfish, frogs, algae, and fish. Maybe snakes, anoles, small birds, and insects.

Did You Know:

1. that the great egret is the symbol of the Audubon Society.

- Male's are brightly colored with gray heads, white cheeks, a black bib, and a rufous neck.
- Females are a plain buffy-brown overall with dinky gray or light brown buffy-brown
- Wingspan is 7.5-9.8 in 19-25 cm
- Weight 1-1 oz 27-29 g

Nest/Nesting Materials:

- Made out of bark branches sticks scraps twigs string paper garbage grass and leaves

Eggs:

- They have oval and white dots and gray dots they lay up to 1-8 eggs

Food:

- They eat any food on the ground. White millet is the favorite bird seed for sparrows. They also eat certain kinds of caterpillars and they eat berries and insects.

3. Did you know that House Sparrows can dive and fly.

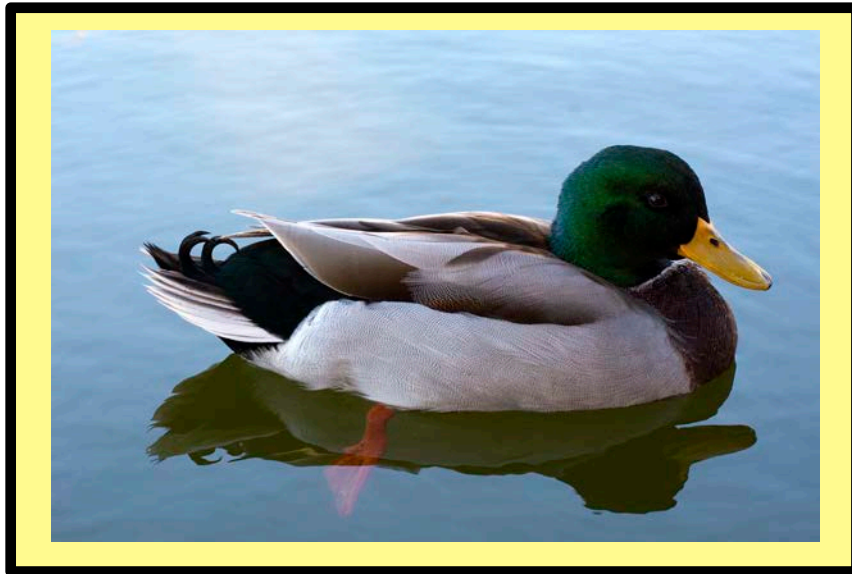
