- Black And White Wings And Tail
- Orange Beak
- Pink Feet
- Length: 4-5 Inches; Weight: 0.4-0.5 Ounces; Wingspan:
 7-9 Inches

- Shrub Nest
- Nesting Materials: Leaves,
 Plant Fibers and Needles
- Nestling Period: 11-17 Days



American Kestrel

Habitat:

- Sparse trees in Maine
- Lakes, trees that are four to five feet tall
- Open woodland and meadows

Physical Description:

- Most colors of all of the raptors
- Wing tips are usually bent back
- Almost the same size as a mourning dove
- Males have dark blue wings
- Female wings are a mix of red and brown

Nest:

- They usually rely on old woodpecker nests
- The male looks for a nest and shows the female for final results

Eggs:

- Under damp lukewarm grass
- Small and about 0.9-1.1 in.
- Mom sits on grass to keep eggs from moving

Food:

 Mostly cicadas, beetles, and small rodents such as snakes and lizards.

Did You Know?

- Did you know that they are a mix of perching and predators?
- Male fight for attention
- Groups of four to five can carry a bald eagle home for food





Blue Jay

Habitat:

- Blue Jays are found in all kinds of forests but especially near oak trees
- They are found in woodlots parks especially where oaks or bird feeders are found in urban and suburban areas

Physical Description:

- Blue jays are smaller than crows, larger than robins
- Length 9.8-11.8 in and wingspan
 13.4-16.9 in
- Weight 2.5-3.5 oz.

Nest:

- Blue Jays make their nest with twigs, grass and sometimes mud too.
- Blue Jays build their nests in the crotch or thick branches of a tree usually 10-25 feet above the ground

Eggs:

- 2-7 eggs
- 1 brood
- Nestling period: 17-21 days
- Incubation period: 17-18 days
- Egg length 1-1.3in and egg width 0.7-0.9 in

Food:

- They eat nuts and seeds from trees.
- They glean insects and eat fruits too.

- Open country
- · A lot of trees
- Grassland
- Short grass
- Telephone Wire
- Nest boxes

Physical Description:

- 3.8 Inches
- 9.12 Wingspan
- 1 ounce
- · Royal blue back
- Red brown breast
- White belly

Nest:

- Wood pecker whole
- Woven grass pine needles
- Turkey feathers
- · Loosely weaved grass
- Lined with fine grass
- · Horse hair

Eggs:

- 7-2 Eggs
- · Pale blue
- More than one brood per year
- 7-9 inches
- · Rarely white
- Nesting period 17-21 days

Food:

- Insects
- Fruits
- Little animals
- · Bird feeders

Did You Know?

- They can see an insect from 60 feet high.
- The male's display at there nests to attract females.
- The oldest Eastern Bluebird was 10 years and 5 months old.

- Clutch size is 1-13 eggs.
- Number of broods: 1-2
- Color: creamy to grayish or greenish



- Wingspan- about 80-90 inches

- The nest is like a bowl
- The nest can hold 1-11 eggs

Eggs:

- Blue-green then turn white then brown
- Oval shape
- 2-3 inches

Northern Cardinal

Habitat:

- Forest
- Fields
- Shrubs
- Trees
- Hedgerows

Physical Description:

- The Northern cardinal length is 8.3-9.1 in or 21-23 cm.
- Their wingspan is 9.8-12.2 in or 1-31 cm.
- Their weight is 1-5-1.7oz or 42-48 g
- 1-21 broods

Nest:

- It takes about 3 to 9 days to build
- It is squeezed into a small branch or vine tangle.
- Hidden 1-15 feet high
- It is 2-3 inches tall

Eggs:

- Their egg length is 0.9-11 in and 2.2-2.7 cm
- Their egg width is 0.7-0.8 in and
 1.7-2 cm
- They lay 2-5 eggs

Food:

- · Black oil sunflower seeds
- All berries
- Corn
- Insects

Did You Know?

- What makes a bird a bird is it's tail feathers?
- Birds fluff their feathers.
- Feathers help bird's swim.



- Held together with spider silk
- 6-10 days to build the nest
- 2 inches across
- 1 inch deep

Eggs:

· Shape: Oval

Clutch size: 1-3 eggs

• Incubation period: 12-14 days

• Size: 0.3-0.6 inches

· Color: White

Food:

- Nectar
- Insects and Spiders: Gnats, Mosquitos, Small Bees
- Tree Sap

Did You Know?

- These birds prefer to feed from red or orange flowers
- Ruby-throated hummingbirds beat their wings 53 times per second

Habitat:

- Trees
- · Open grassland
- Suburban backyards
- Parks
- Woodlots

Physical Description:

- · Perching feet
- · White breast
- Black crown
- Chisel beak
- · Blocky head
- · Wide shoulders

Nest:

- 1 brood
- 1-3 weeks to dig nesting hole
- Nest in dead trees
- Nesting period 18-21 days
- Makes nest out of sticks

Eggs:

- Can lay 3-8 eggs
- · Eggs are completely white
- Incubation period 12 days
- Eggs hatch naked
- Pink skin when hatched

Food:

- Insects
- Sunflower seeds
- Occasionally drinking from humming bird feeders

Did You Know?

- Divide up in winter to look for food
- Don't sing songs
- Drum loudly against wood
- Nesting inside the walls of buildings
